Emergency Codes and Your Role with Each

Code	Role
Suspicious Activity	Do not approach. Call a Non-Emergency Number unless you feel threatened. Then call an Emergency Number or use the Red Emergency Phones.
Code Gray - Severe Weather	Close Windows, doors, blinds. AND follow your departmental procedures.
Code Exodus - Evacuation	Only evacuate if your department is instructed. <i>See departmental procedures for evacuation route and where to meet the rest of your department.</i>
Code Green - Mass Casualty	Clinical Employees will be guided by Clinical Administration.
Code Red Fire	CODE RED is used to announce all fire and smoke situations. Do not shout fire! It may alarm patients and visitors. All fires, regardless of size and all burning odors must be reported immediately. Only evacuate or react if your area is called overhead, you see a fire or you are told by the Fire Department. <i>See departmental procedures for pull stations and evacuation route.</i>
Code Pink - Missing/Abducted Child	Code Pink is intended to protect an infant/child who may be missing from potential mishandling and/or abduction. The infant/child may be a patient or visitor. <i>See departmental procedures for your role in a code pink.</i>

<p>Code Amber - Bomb Threat</p>	<p>Code Amber is used to announce to the campus that a credible bomb threat or that a suspicious package/item is at UAMS Northwest.</p> <p><i>See policy departmental procedures for details on how to proceed.</i></p>
<p>Code Black - Active Shooter</p> <p>Code Black Active Shooter cont.</p>	<p>CODE BLACK is called in the event of a violent occurrence on campus. Special procedures are needed to ensure maximum safety and prevention of injury/loss of life. As a result, multiple responses are necessitated by all components of UAMS. Law enforcement is paramount in securing the situation, but the rest of the campus must work to ensure patient, student, visitor and staff safety. Violent actions on campus could include an active shooter, hostage situation and other scenarios not depicted here. While this is primarily a law enforcement operation; incident management, sheltering in place and crisis communications are integral to the safety and security of the Campus.</p> <p>Notification may come by way of reports of violent actions or potential for violence.</p> <p>If you see or hear a violent situation, take safety precautions and call 911. Report weapons seen and shots fired</p> <p>If you are notified of a CODE BLACK, immediately take safety measures to protect yourself. Continue safety measures until all clear or when you are instructed to evacuate by emergency personnel. All emergency personnel must display proper credentials at all times. There will be no access to the campus until determined by emergency personnel.</p> <p><i>See departmental procedures for your role in a code black.</i></p>
